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SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST

Oak Park got its lone win of the 2019 Finals in the last event to get the Division 1 team title.

The Oak Park girls track & field team won the final event of Saturday's MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 Finals.

That victory in the 1,600 relay was the Knights' lone victory of the meet. However, a lack of individual winners didn't prevent them from going back-to-back as overall champions.

Oak Park's depth was on display as it scored 74 points to win the Finals at East Kentwood High School. Detroit Renaissance took runner-up with 71 points, while Rockford was third with 69.

The Knights have won five Division 1 titles over the last six years.

"A complete team win, and we were solid across the board," Oak Park coach Brandon Jiles said. "I think it's the first championship we've won where we've only won one event, but they placed in everything else so it worked out for us. It was a great meet."

Oak Park won the 1,600 relay with Jayla Jones, Tamyra Todd, Kourtney Kennard and Chloe Vines in a meet record-breaking time of 3:45.13.

"I'm so humbled and excited," Vines said. "I'm proud of myself because there are times I don't think I'm capable of doing certain things, but my teammates trusted me. The girls with me are all underclassmen and they are so motivational and inspiring. They make me want to do great."

Jiles believed his team had the talent and depth to win even without notching first-place finishes.

"We were really balanced across the board this year," Jiles said. "We weren't exceptional in anything, but we were really good in a lot of things."

"It's a little bit sweeter when you can win a tight battle with two other great teams. Renaissance was outstanding in sprints, and Rockford was amazing with their distance and overall team. I have a lot of respect for those teams, and we had to get the best out of our kids to even think about winning."

Rockford senior Ericka VanderLende won the 1,600 (4:41.00) and 3,200 (10:24.57) and was runner-up in the 800.

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In Division 2, Corunna took the title with 54 points, while Holland Christian was second with 49. Corunna was carried by a standout day from junior Hannah Hollister, who won individual titles in the 300-meter hurdles (44.12) and 200 meters (25.26). She also anchored a 400-meter relay winner and took third in the 110 hurdles, won by Marysville's Kaia Scheffler.

Division 3 saw Shepherd senior Amber Gall win the 800-meter run and the 1,600, and help her team to a first-place finish in the 3,200 relay (9:33.89). But, it was Pewamo-Westphalia winning its first team title since 2015 and fourth overall as it finished with 45 points. No Pewamo-Westphalia athlete placed first, but two of its relays, in the 800 and 3,200, placed second.

In Division 4, Fowler successfully repeated as meet champions with a narrow eight-point win over runner-up Pittsford. The title was Fowler's third in four years and fifth since 2011.

Fowler finished with only two first places, both by Alyssa Vandegriff, but added three seconds, a third and two fourths.

Gladstone Team Effort Takes UP Division 1 Crown

The Gladstone Braves won the 2019 MHSAA Upper Peninsula Division 1 Boys meet with 127 points, 30 ahead of both Ishpeming Westwood and Marquette – the runners-up in Gladstone's league title wins. The Braves also broke a four-year Finals winning streak for Marquette, the UP's largest school with 950 students – twice as many as Gladstone's 460.

Gladstone had 40 athletes on its team, and just fewer than half – 18 – qualified for the Finals during the Braves' 24-point win at their May 16 Regional. Of that 18, 15 placed among the top six to score in their events at the June 1 Finals.

This Braves team enjoyed an important variety of talented athletes – with a boost from a comeback by one of the program's best all-time. Adam Bruce had hip surgery in January and didn't start racing again until May. But whereas Gladstone didn't place anyone in the 1,600 and 3,200 during the 2013 title run, Bruce won both races this time both at the Regional and Finals. He didn't get up to speed to break his school records set in both in 2018, but still came through with 20 points at the championship meet.

Calvin Thibault repeated as winner in both hurdles races and took third in the 100 and second in the 200. Sophomore Blake Servant won the discus by more than five feet, and junior Luke Van Brocklin just missed breaking the school record in the 400 while finishing second in a fast, tightly-contested race. Senior hurdler/sprinter James McKnight and junior thrower Greg Chenier also placed in multiple individual events.

The Division 2 championship went to Ishpeming for the fifth title in six years, followed by Newberry at 84 and Norway with 75 points. Ishpeming was led by junior Jonah Broberg, who won the 800-meter run and the 1,600 (4:45.81), and placed second in the 3,200 run (10:38.7).

In Division 3, Bessemer's 136 points were enough to comfortably win its second straight Finals after taking second place in 2017. Bessemer's Uriah Aili set Division 3 UP Finals records in the 800, 1,600 and 3,200. Aili's 800 was timed at 1:59.93, beating his own record (2:01.08) from 2018. He set the 1,600 record with a time of 4:28.68, five seconds faster than Cedarville's Thomas Bohn ran in setting the previous record in 2018.

Marquette Regains Championship Form – John Vrancic and Adam Niemi, Special for Second Half

The race for the 2019 Upper Peninsula Division 1 girls track & field championship came down to the wire as Marquette edged reigning champion Negaunee 106-100. Marquette secured its eighth title in nine years by winning the 1600-meter relay in four minutes, 14.58 seconds.

Negaunee, which held a three-point lead going into the day's final race, took sixth in the 1,600.

"What a day," said Marquette coach Natalie Messano. "It was a battle all day. Negaunee has a great team. It's real stressful as a coach, although I had faith in our girls. We had our eye on the trophy. But they made us work for it, that's for sure."

Negaunee gained the upper hand in the previous race with juniors Emily Paupore and Talon Prusi going 1-2 in the 3,200 run on this sunny and warm day at Flivver Field.

Paupore retained her 3,200 title in 11:57.64, with Prusi at 12:32.67 and Marquette sophomore Josie Danielkiewicz third (12:36.32).

Marquette swept the relays, also taking the 400 (52.06), 800 (1:49.55) and 3,200 (10:07.44).

Emily Paupore added firsts in the 800 (2:23) and 1,600 (5:16.79). Norman won high jump at five feet, long jump (16-1) and 300 hurdles (45.56) and was runner-up to Menominee sophomore Mackenzie Wellner (16.43) by just more than half a second in the 100 hurdles.

The Division 2 Final again went to St. Ignace, as the Saints achieved a three-peat in convincing fashion with 130 points, followed by Ishpeming with 61 and Bark River-Harris at 54.

St. Ignace grabbed seven firsts, including a trio by Libby Becker.

The senior distance ace captured the 800-meter run in two minutes, 23.1 seconds; 1,600 (5:20.63) and 3,200 (12:13.88).

"It was really hot," said Becker, who plans to run track and cross country at Michigan State in 2019-20. "The heat kind of got to me. My main goal was just to win the 3,200. I was pretty happy with my 800 and 1,600. Madeleine (Peramaki) really helped me with those."

Lake Linden-Hubbell also cruised to its third straight MHSAA Division 3 UP Finals championship. The Lakes scored 112 points, well ahead of runner-up Felch North Dickinson's 62.

The Lakes' third straight title came on the strength of gritty determination and hard work, embodied by Sienna Anderson's comeback from an ACL injury a year ago. She took second in the 100 hurdles behind Brimley's Hayley Gamberdella.

The Lakes took five firsts including wins in the 400 meter and 1,600-meter relays. Mariah Willmer won the 800 run. Jamie Hendrickson won the high jump, and Camaryn Crouch won the pole vault.



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Depth Helps Zeeland West to Win

On the heels of three event wins, Zeeland West earned the MHSAA LP Division 2 team title with 53 points, topping Yale (37), Fruitport (33), Dearborn Divine Child (27) and Corunna (26).

"That means we have won every meet we have been to this year," said Zeeland West's Ethan Brooks, the only individual champion for the Dux. "It is awesome."

Zeeland West won the 400 relay at 43.51 seconds, and the 800 relay at 1:29.29.

Brooks won the 300 hurdles at 39.38, edging Fruitport junior Ethan Flores by one hundredth of a second in his quest for a second title on the afternoon. Meanwhile, Flores took the 110 hurdles in 14.53.

From great-grandparents and former coaches to a mother and a son, athletes at this event became champions in honor of some of their loved ones.

Take senior Emari O'Brien of Harper Woods Chandler Park, who became the 100-meter Division 2 champion at 10.97 seconds in honor of former coach Paul Zelmanski, who died in January.

"This whole time I've been running, he told me I was going to win it one year," said O'Brien, who wrote "For Z" on his shoes. "Last year when I (took second place), he said next year when you come back, you're going to win it for sure."

Flores said he had his family, in particular his great-grandmother, on his mind in the starting blocks for the 110 hurdles. All athletes endured a three-and-a-half-hour delay and then another of 45 minutes as storms crept off Lake Michigan. Then, a final delay of more than two hours pushed the event to a 12-hour affair.

Saginaw senior Tony Martin jumped 22-11.25, winning his second straight Division 2 title. That distance came, he said, despite missing the whole board on the championship jump. Martin credited his mother, Kishon, for pushing him through hard times this year, including a pulled hamstring that hampered his season. He also said his son, Isaiah, has been an inspiration.

In Division 1, East Kentwood used recent history as inspiration, notching the school's third team crown in a row, scoring 63.5 points in winning the Finals for the eighth time in 11 years. The Falcons also won three consecutive championships from 2009-11. The Falcons did so despite winning only three events. East Kentwood claimed top honors in the 800 and 1,600 relays, while Stephan Bracey won the long jump (24-1.25).

In one of the more closely-contested Finals, Ithaca won the Division 3 team title with 45 points, one more than runners-up Pewamo-Westphalia and Saugatuck. Harbor Springs placed fourth with 43 points and New Lothrop and Kent City each had 33 to finish in a tie for fifth.

Ithaca did not score any points in the meet's final event, the 1,600 relay. Harbor Springs won that event to garner the 10 points and make a final move up the standings. Pewamo-Westphalia placed third in the 1,600 relay and missed an opportunity to win the team competition. Had the Pirates placed second, they would have earned eight points and won the title by one over Ithaca.

In addition to Allen's fine finishes in the two distance races, Ithaca received valuable points in the field events. Alex VanDeWeghe won the shot put at 59 feet, 7 inches, and placed fifth in the discus. Ithaca's Baylee Chaffin placed second in the discus with a throw of 161 feet, 1 inch.

In Division 4, he Kalamazoo Hackett overcame small numbers to repeat as champion. Despite having just nine athletes competing, Hackett finished with 64 points to 46 for runner-up Southfield Christian. A year earlier, Hackett had six athletes on its Finals roster and finished with 51 points, 15 more than second-place Sand Lake.

Leading the Irish was senior Heath Baldwin, who won the 110 hurdles (14.84), 300 hurdles (40.13) and high jump (6-6) while taking third in the long jump. Baldwin, who said he would never give up competing in four events, finished with 36 points.

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Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year earlier.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2020-21 are: **Brinlee Barry**, Caledonia; **Faith Breinager**, Frankenmuth; **Amina Ferris**, Dearborn; **Nico Johnson**, Britton Deerfield; **Brenna Kosal**, Peck; **Ashton McNabb**, Three Oaks River Valley; **Brock Porter**, Orchard Lake St. Mary's; and **Melik Williams**, Ypsilanti Lincoln.

Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 117 schools from 45 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
