FINAL MEET RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. USTA rules shall apply except where amended by the MHSAA. Foot faults will be called and the Code of Conduct enforced. The Point Penalty System will be in effect (First Offense-Warning; Second Offense-Point; Third Offense-Default). PLEASE REMEMBER: The Point Penalty System is cumulative from the first match of the regional level of the tournament through the last match at the final level.
2. Scoring format is two out of three sets with a set tie-breaker (first to 7, ahead by 2) in any set if games reach 6-all.
3. It is the server's responsibility to call out the score.
4. Keep scoring devices up-to-date on the change-overs.
5. Immediately following each match, winners should report the score and return the balls and school name holder to the tournament desk. Players are responsible for obtaining their next match time from the tournament desk.
6. Report ten minutes prior to scheduled match time, ready to play. The MHSAA time penalty system will be used for lateness.
0 to 5 minutes = loss of one game and choice
5 to less than 10 minutes = loss of two games and choice
10 to less than 15 minutes = loss of three games and choice
15 minutes late = default
7. Players will be given 30 minutes between matches. The time may be shortened if both coaches agree. Warm-up is 10 minutes, including serves. Rest period between 2nd and 3rd set is a maximum of 5 minutes.
8. Players may play a fourth match in a day if they have not played more than six sets total in the first three matches.
9. **Disqualification policy** – This rule applies to players and coaches alike. If a disqualification is given for unsportsmanlike conduct, the recipient is disqualified for the rest of the contest and the next contest.
Penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct after match – For a flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct after a match is completed, the offending player will be defaulted and removed from the site as soon as authorized school personnel become available. This removal will be for the duration of the event (regionals and finals are considered one event). In addition, one point will be deducted from the player's team score. Substitution is not allowed for the defaulted player. This rule will be in effect for all MHSAA tennis tournaments.
10. **Taunting** – MHSAA Handbook Regulation V, Section 3, "Sportsmanship" 225: Taunting includes any actions or comments by coaches, players or spectators which are intended to bait, anger, embarrass, ridicule or demean others, whether or not the deeds or words are vulgar or racist. Included is conduct that

berates, needles, intimidates or threatens based on race, gender, ethnic origin or background, conduct that attacks origin or background, and conduct that attacks religious beliefs, size, economic status, speech, family, special needs or personal matters. Examples of taunting that would lead to ejection include, but are not limited to, “trash talk”; physical intimidation outside the spirit of the game; reference to sexual orientation, “in the face” confrontation by one player to another; standing over/straddling a tackled or fallen player.


236: In all sports, officials to consider taunting a flagrant unsportsmanlike foul that disqualifies the offending bench person or contestant from the contest/day of completion (and next contest/day of completion). A warning may be given, but is not required before ejection.

237: At all MHSAA tournament venues, tournament management may give spectators one warning for taunting. Thereafter, spectators who taunt others are to be ejected by security.

11. **Coaching during play** – A coach (as designated on the entry form and approved by the Principal’s signature only) will be allowed to coach after every odd game. The coach MAY NOT enter the court. Players may not leave the court. All coaching will be done from outside the fence or on the ends of each bank of courts. The 90 second coaching period begins at the finish of the last point, not when conversation begins. No more than one designated coach may coach at any court at any one time. Coaches and assistants must have a name tag furnished by the tournament manager for ID purposes. Improper use of the coaching privilege could result in dismissal of those coaching privileges and/or disqualification of player.
12. **Team coaches** – Teams are allowed up to three coaches on Friday; Limited to two coaches on Saturday. All must be under contract and/or registered with MHSAA as a non-faculty coach.
Head coaches – It is your responsibility that you and your assistant are knowledgeable and aware of the rules and regulations pertaining to high school tennis. Reminder: There shall be no more than two coaches registered during any team competition, dual meet, individual tournament, or MHSAA sponsored tournament.
13. **Scoring** – Each match won by a team member by play or default will count one point toward a team total score (in case of a bye in the first round, a player must win the second round match before they receive a point for the bye). The team score is based on the total cumulative score of each team entry.





No. 1 Singles Flight





No. 2 Singles Flight





No. 4 Singles Flight





No. 1 Doubles Flight




